Financial Grant Request Information Sheet Coupeville Lions Club Community Service Program

Lions Club members as individuals and the Club as a whole participate in and financially support activities and programs that serve the people of our community.

Each year, the Lions Club conducts fundraising events to provide money for community projects. The Coupeville Lions Club Board of Directors will review and evaluate requests for financial support. The recommendations for financial support are then voted upon and forwarded to the membership as required by the by-laws.

Consideration is given to such causes as: civic betterment projects/organizations, vision and hearing care, youth organizations, medical projects, senior citizens, school projects, Lions Club regional and international projects, and charitable organizations. In considering the requests for such causes, desirable characteristics include:

- Capital projects rather than operations funds
- Encouraging self-help by providing seed money or matching funds
- Projects that will primarily benefit Whidbey Island by providing a wider range of services or by touching the lives of a greater number of Whidbey Islander
- Emergency requests after other existing sources of help have been exhausted

However, the BOD is not constrained to considering only those projects that contain the above listed desirable characteristics.

Requests for financial support should be made in writing, (email is acceptable) and submitted to the any Coupeville Lion willing to sponsor the request. The application should contain:
